

Mutual Funds Factsheet April 2023



GLOBAL

- In its latest world economic outlook, the IMF projected global economic growth to moderate to 2.8% in 2023 from 3.4% in 2022. The institution highlighted the impact of geopolitical tensions, weaker prospects from previously fast economies and subdued labour force growth as the main drivers of the revised projection.
- According to the Consumer Price Index (CPI) report for March 2023 in the UK, the CPI increased by 10.1% YoY (compared to 7.0% in March 2022). MoM, CPI increased by 0.8% in March 2023 from 1.1% in February. UK inflation maintained its double-digit as households continue to struggle with rising energy and food prices. As a result, we anticipate that the Bank of England may raise interest rates at its upcoming monetary policy meeting by at least 25 bps, given that inflation remained strong and above target.
- Markets across North America and Europe extended their bullish run in March. The S&P 500 (8.55%) STOXX (3.61%), CAC40 (14.66%) and DAX (12.94%) indices all posted positive year-to-date returns. Similarly, major indices in Asia, such as the Nikkei 225 (+8.72%) and SHCOMP (+9.06%) closed on a positive note.
- In the United States, the Personal Consumption Expenditures (PCE) price index increased 0.1% MoM and 4.2% YoY in March 2023. The core PCE price index which excludes volatile food and energy components, rose 0.3% MoM and 4.6% YoY in March 2023. Consumer spending rose 0.3% in March (vs 0.2% in February). We opine that the strong labour market continues to keep spending elevated despite the previous aggressive interest rate hikes embarked upon by the Fed.

DOMESTIC

- Nigeria's crude oil production declined to 1.35MMbpd in March from 1.37MMbpd in February on the back of declining investments and production sabotage. However, this contraction is the first since September 2022.
- In March, headline inflation advanced to 22.04% YoY from 21.91% YoY in February. This is following increases in its two subcomponents, Core inflation (+102bps) and Food inflation (+10bps) to 19.86% YoY and 24.45% YoY, respectively. Similarly, on a MoM basis, headline inflation edged upwards by 15bps to 1.86% (vs. 1.71% in February 2023).
- Few weeks to the planned phase-out of the fuel subsidy, the Minister of Finance, Budget and National Planning, Zainab Ahmed, announced the suspension of the subsidy removal, highlighting the need for further consultations with key stakeholders, including the incoming administration.

FINANCIAL MARKET UPDATE

EQUITIES

- The local bourse closed in the positive territory in April. However, it shed 4.5% of its March gains, pushing the year-to-date return to 2.2% from 7.0%.
- This was partly driven by the rise in yields in the fixed income market amid moderate system liquidity, as investors took profit in the equities market.
- On a sectoral basis, year-to-date performance remained positive across all sectors under our coverage. The Industrial Goods (+1.83% ytd), Consumer Goods (+25.00% ytd), Oil and Gas (+8.60% ytd), Insurance (+5.75% ytd), and Banking (+4.93% ytd) sectors all closed on a positive note.

FIXED INCOME

- In April 2023, the secondary fixed income market closed bearish as average yield edged up 7bps MoM to settle at 10.72%.
- Average stop rates at the NTB auctions in April 2023 surged by 167bps to 8.70% from 7.02% in March. This is following an uptrend in rates across all tenors, with the 91-day bill instrument recording the most increase (+232bps to 5.65%). However, the secondary NT-Bills market closed positive as average yield fell by 43bps MoM to 7.30%.
- At the FGN Bonds primary market auction, average stop rate edged upwards by 8bps to 15.27% (vs. 14.93% in March 2023). The bearish sentiment extended to the secondary bonds market as average yields increased by 57bps MoM to 14.13% in April.

OUTLOOK



GLOBAL MARKETS

We expect the US Federal Reserve to continue to take policy actions to reduce inflation rate while considering the impact on economic growth. In the same vein, we anticipate that the Eurozone will not be left out in its fight against inflation in the region. However, concerns about financial stability will continue to make many central banks move cautiously.

We foresee that larger banks in the US will continue to record higher deposits given the doubt about many regional banks following the recent collapse of the First Republic Bank. We are of the opinion that the impact of higher rates in the banking sector may have a long-lasting impact on economic activities across the US, UK, and Eurozone.

DOMESTIC MARKETS

EQUITY

We expect mixed sentiments to permeate the equities market in May. We base our prognosis on profit-taking activities from investors as volatility remains high in the market. Also, ahead of the monetary policy meeting and expectations of a further rate hike, we expect elevated fixed income yields to impact equity performance negatively. On the other hand, we believe that the expected profit-taking activities will provide the opportunity for investors to take positions in fundamentally sound names at attractive entry points.

FIXED INCOME

In the fixed income market, yields are expected to be elevated on the back of the high inflation rate, tight system liquidity towards the end of May and possible CRR debits by the CBN within the month. Consequently, we favour short-dated instruments over longer-maturing ones in the near term.
