March 2024



MACRO ECONOMIC UPDATE



GLOBAL

- The US Consumer Price Index increased by 0.4% in February. after rising by 0.3% in January. Over the last 12 months, the all-items index increased by 3.2% before seasonal adjustment.
- The S&P Global Flash US Composite Output Index fell to 52.2pts in March 2024, from 52.5pts in February, driven by a softer uptick in services. Similarly, in the UK, business activity noted an expansion for the fifth consecutive month albeit at its slowest pace since January 2024 to reach 52.9pts in March 2024, down from the 53.0pts recorded in February.
- The Personal Consumption Expenditures (PCE) price index in the US increased by 0.3% MoM and 2.5% YoY in February 2024. The core PCE price index, which excludes volatile food and energy components, rose by 0.3% MoM and 2.8% YoY in February 2024. Consumer spending rose by 0.8% in February (vs 0.2% in January).
- The Bank of Japan (BOJ) raised its lending rate for overnight borrowing by banks to a range of 0%-0.1%. This decision underscores a significant pivot from the BOJ's ultraloose monetary policy stance.
- All major indices under our coverage gained over the period as the S&P 500 (+10.63% YTD), FTSE (+2.84% YTD), Euro STOXX 50 (+11.16% YTD), DOWJONES (+5.62% YTD), the SHCOMP (2.23% YTD), and Nikkei 225 (+20.63% YTD) indices all closed higher.

DOMESTIC

- Headline inflation extended its uptick by 180bps in February as it rose to 31.70% YoY (vs. 29.90% YoY in January) as both food (+251bps to 37.92% YoY) and core (+154bps to 25.13% YoY) reported a surge.
- The Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) announced the successful clearance of a USD7bn backlog of valid foreign exchange transactions, fulfilling the CBN Governor's commitment to ending the protracted concern.
- At the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) meeting in March 2024, the Committee hiked the Monetary Policy Rate (MPR) further by 200bps to 24.75%. This move reflects the CBN's effort to curb inflation and attract FPI inflows.
- The Stanbic IBTC Bank Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) remained unchanged at 51.0pts in March remaining where it was in February 2024.
- In 2023FY, Total Trade grew by 37.21% YoY to NGN71.88trn. The growth follows an upswing in both Total Imports (+40.36% YoY to NGN35.92trn) and Total Exports (+34.20% YoY to NGN25.59trn). Overall, Nigeria's Balance of Trade rested at a surplus of NGN2.90bn in 2023FY.

FINANCIAL MARKET UPDATE



FIXED INCOME

Primary Market

- At the NTB auctions in March 2024, the average stop rate surged by 43bps MoM to 18.38%, compared to 17.96% in February 2024. Similarly, the average bid-to-cover ratio rose to 10.14x, compared to 8.57x in February 2024. Influx of liquidity from maturities and portfolio rotation came into the market as investors capitalize on the elevated yield environment.
- In March 2024, the Debt Management Office (DMO) auctioned NGN450bn worth of bonds through the reopening of two (2) existing instruments (FEB 2031 and FEB 2034) and opening of a 3-year bond (MAR-2027). The average stop rate closed at 20.13% and average bid-to-cover was 1.37x compared to the 18.75% and 1.67x respectively in February 2024. The slowdown in bid to cover ratio is in line with the expectation that rates would remain elevated for longer which favors short term exposure and reduces traction for bond instruments.

Secondary Market

• In March 2024, the secondary fixed income market closed negative, as average yield increased by 148bps MoM to 18.54%. Similarly, the NT-Bill market closed bearish as average yield surged by 76bps MoM to 17.66%. Likewise, the FGN Bond market ended on a negative note, as average yield went up by 219bps MoM to close at 19.41%.

EQUITIES

- In March 2024, the NGX ASI increased by 4.58% MoM to settle at 104,562.06 points, bringing the Nigerian Equities market to a bullish close. Consequently, the market gained 39.84% YtD in March 2024, compared to 33.71% YtD in February 2024.
- In March 2024, only the Banking (+21.21% MoM) and Insurance (+10.44% MoM) sectors closed positive, while the Industrial Goods (-0.92% MoM), Consumer Goods (-0.78% MoM) and Oil and Gas (-0.66% MoM) sectors posted losses.


Growth of N10,000 investment since 31/12/2020



MARKET & MACRO OUTLOOK



GLOBAL MARKETS

In March 2024, major central banks held policy rates constant. The Euro Area, UK and US have emphasized the need to continuously reassess general macro data as well as current inflation trajectory, to determine the appropriate time for a policy reversal. However, the general market sentiment is for inflation to taper down considerably toward their 2% target levels in 2024. In the US, Fed Futures are currently pricing in a 60% probability of a rate cut as early as June 2024, while predictions for cuts in the EU and UK are for H2:2024.

In Asia, the Bank of Japan ended its 8-year negative interest rate and yield curve control policies by guiding its new policy rate within a 0-0.1% range. In China, we observed the seasonality factor following the Spring Festival holidays support output growth. Its official PMI data showed its first expansion in its manufacturing sector to 50.8 points (from 49.1 points) in six months. Overall, we maintain our view on the possible escalation in global geopolitical conflicts as well as a struggling Chinese economy limiting progress toward a full global recovery.

GLOBAL EQUITIES

In April 2024, we expect that the renewed optimism around rate cut would impact the market positively as investors take position in anticipation of the decision.

DOMESTIC MARKETS

EQUITY

The domestic bourse is currently caught amid sustained hawkish monetary policy, improving exchange rate outlook, and expectations of the release of corporate earnings. On a balance of factor, we expect the overall performance of the equities market to be muted in April.

FIXED INCOME

As the Central Bank continues to tighten liquidity in the system by adjusting Monetary Policy Rate and other policy parameters, we opine that yields would remain on the upside in April 2024.
